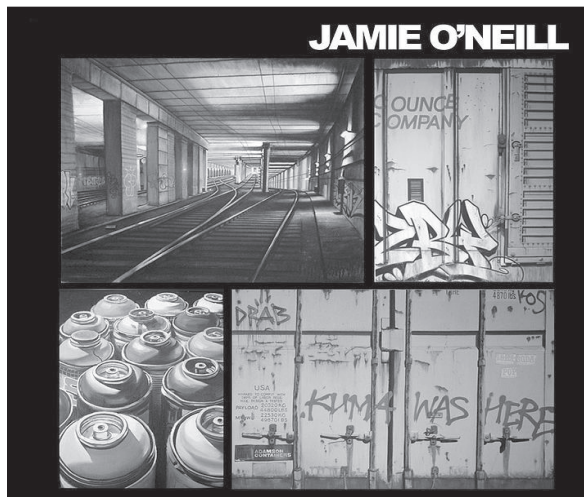

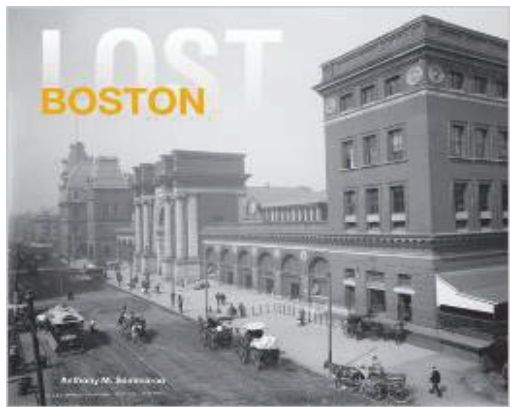


IN BETWEEN THE LINES

Artist Fellowships in a range of disciplines are awarded to primary creators of original works of art. The Artist Fellowships provide competitive grants of \$10,000 and finalist awards of \$1,000. The number of awards per discipline category varies according to the number of applications reviewed, the recommendations of each panel, and program funds available.
