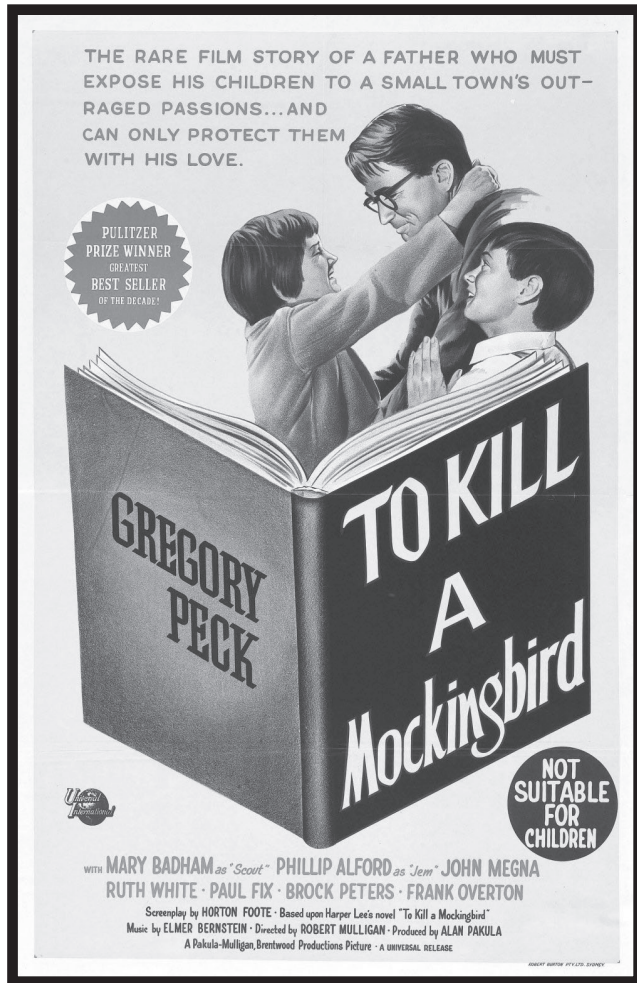

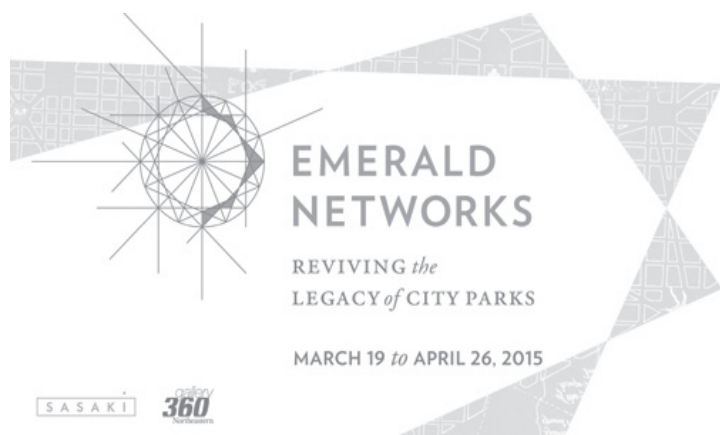
Movies with Meaning.
