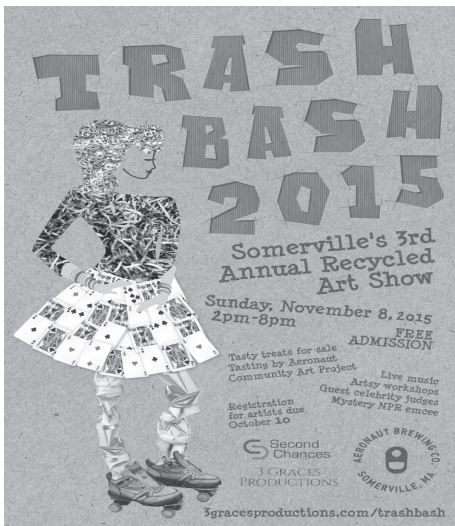

Please join us for the next BNN Neighborhood Art Gallery Reception on Monday November 2, 2015 from 5:30-7 pm. The exhibit about Black Veterans, male and female, is curated by BNN CTV producer and founder of the Veterans Reading Brigade, Haywood Fennell. The 13 pieces of art being displayed were created by youth involved in the Artist for Humanity Program. Each student artist involved was required to research their subject in order to learn more about the individual, as well as the unequal citizenship they operated under while risking their lives in combat. The exhibit was completed for Black History Month and put on display at the Mass. State House in 2012 and at Newton City Hall in 2014 as well as the Strand Theater in Dorchester, MA during the summer of 2014.
