LATIN QUARTER ARTS FESTIVAL AND HISPANIC HERITAGE MONTH SERIES

Hyde Square Task Force is pleased to announce the the first annual Latin Quarter Arts Festival, Saturday September 19, 12-9pm. The festival features works by nationally and internationally acclaimed artists; Genesis Báez, Raul Gonzales III, Pat Falco, and Anabel Vásquez Rodríguez through guest curator Zo. E. Ling as well as a sensor-controlled life size labyrinth game by the Boston Makers.

The works included all focus on exploring, celebrating, and preserving the cultural heritage of Boston's Latin Quarter through ethnography, photography, interactive projects, installation, video and sound. Installations and ongoing projects encompass the critical timeline of cultural preservation, the spirit of an evolving Latin community and the navigation of a multi-dimensional sense of identity. Featured artists will create spaces of cultural nostalgia in a physical claiming of space as well as interact with community members in a collaborative series of projects that celebrate the past triumphs, current lives and future plans of the individuals within the neighborhood. The Latin Quarter is a square mile in Jamaica Plain which spans the Hyde/ Jackson square area. The event coincides with Hispanic Heritage Month, & JP Open Studios. A reception will take place Saturday September 19, 2015, 7:30-9pm, musically hosted by the Picó Picante collective and featuring guest DJ Sol Nova with dancing and light refreshments.
