A Night for the Young at Heart!



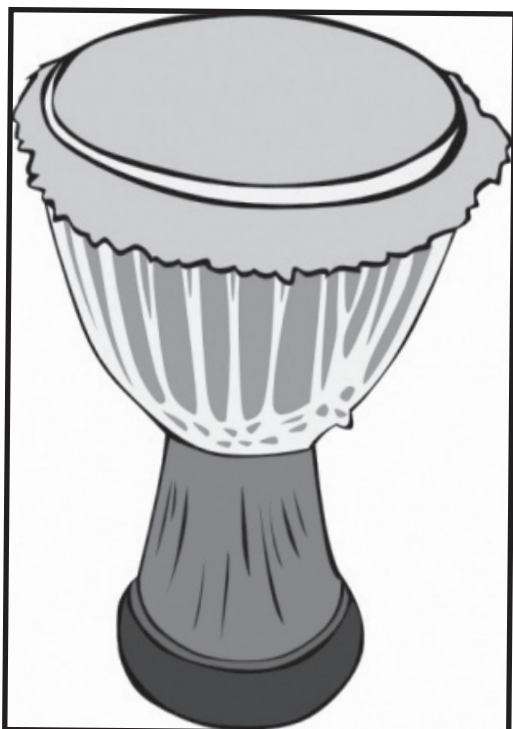
Get a chance to be a kid again.
